# Policy for Persons with Disabilities (PwD) Students of Bokaro Steel Mines College

#### Introduction

# **Objectives of the Policy**

The primary objectives of this policy are:

- > To offer necessary academic accommodations and support services.

- ➤ To establish a grievance redressal mechanism for addressing challenges faced by PwD students.

## **Definition of Persons with Disabilities (PwD)**

In accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, PwD students include those with:

- Visual impairment (blindness, low vision)
- Hearing impairment (deaf, hard of hearing)
- Locomotor disabilities (paralysis, limb impairment, dwarfism)
- Intellectual and learning disabilities (dyslexia, autism, developmental disorders)
- Speech and language disabilities
- Multiple disabilities


## **Accessibility and Infrastructure Support**

- Dedicated spaces for PwD students in the library and study areas.

- > Fee concessions or waivers as per government policies.
- > Assistance in availing financial support for assistive devices.

# A. Counseling and Mentorship

- > Establishment of a dedicated PwD Student Support Cell.
- Regular counseling services for academic, career, and mental health support.
- > Peer mentorship programs for PwD students.

#### B. Residential and Transport Assistance

- > Prioritization of PwD students in hostel accommodation.
- > Accessible transport facilities within the campus.
- > Coordination with local transport authorities for accessible public transport options.

#### **Extracurricular and Co-Curricular Activities**

- > Encouragement of PwD students' participation in cultural, literary, and sports activities.
- Modification of sports and recreational activities to accommodate PwD students.
- Organization of exclusive events and activities promoting inclusion.

## **Awareness and Sensitization Programs**

- > Regular workshops and training sessions for faculty, staff, and students on disability awareness.
- > Inclusion of disability rights and inclusion topics in orientation programs.
- Observance of important disability-related days to foster inclusivity.

#### **Grievance Redressal Mechanism**
