





q1 How much curriculum was included in the class



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q2_How well did the teacher prepare for the class



q3_How well were the teachers able to communicate



q4_Fairness of internal assessment (mid-sem/end sem) process by teachers





q6_The teaching and mentoring process in your institution helps you with cognitive, social and emotional development






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q8_Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes



q9_Your teacher makes a necessary follow-up with the task assigned to you



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q10_Teachers explain the concept through examples and applications



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q11_Teachers identify your strengths and encourage you to provide the right level of challenges





q16_What percentage of teachers use ICT equipment's like LCD projectors, multimedia etc. while teaching


